COMMUNITY REMINDERS

Reminder: Take Care of Your Pets

Your pets can be your best friends. They are even viewed as family members by many. However, their behavior can affect your neighbors. Here are some things to be aware of as your pets navigate this all-too human world:

- Pets are not equipped to handle traffic. They don't know to get out of the street if a car is coming. If you are walking your dog, please keep them on a leash. If you have a cat, please consider the fact that indoor cats face far fewer hazards than outdoor ones.
- Dogs, in particular, bark when they want attention. This is natural behavior, but it is also a behavior that may be distracting to your neighbors, particularly if it happens often or for long periods of time. If your dog is barking, they are trying to tell you something. Please attend to your dog's needs.
- When you walk your dog, please pick up after them and do not leave the bag behind to pick up later. Any bag left in the mow strip could be stepped on by someone getting out of a car.

Be Safe: Lock Vehicle, Garage, and Residence Doors

The City of Carlsbad Police have urged residents to lock up their homes and vehicles for many years. Whenever you exit your vehicle, lock it. When you aren't entering or exiting your garage, close it. When you are inside your home it is best to keep the doors locked. Also, use window locks.



These may seem like common sense things to do, but it is surprising how often a vehicle is left unlocked and items are stolen.

This problem is not common in La Costa Ridge, but it does happen. Recently, there have been reports of a nighttime prowler, checking vehicle doors to see whether they are unlocked. The prowler also was looking in residence windows to see what might be inside. Please take your valuables out of your cars and be safe by locking everything up!

COMMON AREA REQUESTS

Maintaining Areas Outside of Your Property

You may find that there is a tree or bush not inside your property boundaries that you feel should be trimmed. Please do not do this yourself or hire someone to do it. It is not on your property so it's not yours to trim or remove. Landscape maintenance in the common areas is solely the responsibility of the Association, and homeowners should not cut, shape, or remove any of our community landscape elements.
